CHRIST THE KING CATHOLIC SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

JULY 22, 2020 MEETING MINUTES

A meeting of the Advisory Council (the "Council") of Christ the King Catholic School ("CKS") was held via video conference on July 22, 2020 at 5:30 p.m. Dr. O'Sullivan opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of the July 16, 2020 Minutes

Mr. Archie presented the minutes from the July 16, 2020 Council Meeting (the "Minutes"). Mr. Raymond moved to approve the Minutes, which Mrs. Snyder seconded. The Council unanimously approved the Minutes.

School Re-Opening Plan

Dr. O'Sullivan reported that after meeting with the CSO and the Bishop, the decision has been made that all diocesan schools in Dallas County will start on campus learning on September 2nd. There will be no e-Learning prior to that date. The school year could be extended by one week in June, but no decision has been made with respect to extending the school year. Dr. O'Sullivan reported that there may be opportunities throughout the school year to do e-Learning to make up for starting school in September instead of August.

Dr. O'Sullivan reported that the school year will start with some half days and no school on Friday. The current plan is for the students to attend school five days a week (full days) starting September 21st.

Dr. O'Sullivan also reported that there will be no extracurricular activities or sports during the first semester. There is a possibility for these activities to resume in January, but that decision will be made at a later date.

The Council then discussed the re-opening plan as presented to the Council by Dr. O'Sullivan and Dr. Bosco. Dr. O'Sullivan reported that there is a plan to have all school masses and that maybe half of the students will attend in-person and the other half of the students will watch the mass in their classroom.

Dr. O'Sullivan reported that the parent survey regarding whether a family intends to attend school in person or do virtual learning from home will be sent out today and responses are due by August 15th. The re-opening plan will also be distributed to all families. If a family chooses to do virtual learning from home, that commitment will need to be made for the first nine weeks of school.

Dr. O'Sullivan and Dr. Bosco will be holding grade level meetings to review the reopening plan and answer any questions. Mr. Hudson will also provide technology sessions for parents in August.

The Council discussed the screening process for students entering the school building each morning. More guidance from the Superintendent is expected on this issue in the future.

Closing

There being no further business to come before the Council, Dr. O'Sullivan closed the meeting at $6:12\ p.m.$ with a prayer.
