From the CKS Clinic:

Dear CKS Families,

We would like to take this time to thank you for your continued support of all the COVID-19 safety precautions the Diocese of Dallas and CKS have put in place. We are extremely grateful for your support in keeping our faculty, staff, and students safe while on the CKS campus.

Due to the dramatic rise in COVID-19 cases within diocesan schools, going forward CKS will require all students to remain at home if a household member is symptomatic, there has been a possible COVID-19 exposure, or a household member has pending COVID-19 lab results, even if the other members of the household are not displaying symptoms.

One very important layer of mitigation in place to keep our students, faculty, and staff safe and healthy on the CKS campus is the daily Symptom Screening Form.

If anyone selects yes, to any of the questions, all students in the family should remain at home.

The student(s) will then be moved to virtual learning.

As per the CKS Re-Opening Plan, "All parents will complete a daily COVID-19 screening form for each student to determine attending school. • If a screening form is incomplete, the student will not be permitted to enter the school."

A Message from the Health & Safety Committee:

Dear CKS Parents and Staff,

We would like to draw your attention to the letter from the diocese shared on 1/29/21 by Dr. Bosco. In the past several months, children with sick household contacts were able to attend school while the sick contact waited for COVID testing results. This is no longer the case. Children with sick household contacts will not be allowed to be on campus until the sick member of the household has been evaluated and has received negative PCR test results. With the advent of more infectious COVID strains circulating in our community, we must approach our safety procedures with renewed vigilance in order to keep our campus open to inperson learning. Please seek prompt PCR testing for yourselves and your family members when they exhibit sick symptoms, or if they have had a close contact. We ask you to complete the daily symptom screener each morning before you bring your children to school. Please revisit the importance of masking and hand washing with your children, and keep children at home at the first sign of illness.


Please contact Nurse Wrozek at the school, or your doctor, if you have any questions about symptoms, a potential exposure, or whether or not your child or family can safely be on campus.
