10 Things You Can Do to Prepare for Returning Back to School

- 1 Practice Hand Hygiene** often throughout the day. Teach them to sing their ABCs or count for at least 20 seconds, ensuring they wash the front, back, & in-between their fingers.
- 2 Practice Putting Mask On/Off.** Your child will be required to wear a mask upon entering school & at all times. Teach them to not touch the outside/inside of their mask when taking it off/putting it on.
- 3 Make/Purchase Extra Masks.** Masks should only be used one time. Consider making or buying multiple masks to give you the proper time to wash them between uses.
- 4 Purchase a Thermometer.** Check your child's temperature every morning. If 100.0°F or higher, they must stay home and contact the CKS clinic for further instructions before returning to school. If they develop a fever at school, the parent will be notified and required to pick up the student.
- 5 Practice 6ft of Distance.** Measure the distance on the floor. Consider temporarily placing visual markers indicating 6' in your home.
- 6 Update Immunizations & Physical.** Each is required to enroll for the school year. Contact your child's pediatrician for an appointment. Immunizations can also be obtained at the Health Dept.
- 7 Change Aerosolized Medication.** Nebulizers & inhalers without a chamber cannot be administered in school. Speak with your child's pediatrician to obtain the proper equipment & to update the Asthma Action Plan.
- 8 Purchase Reusable Water Bottle** to be brought to school. Water fountains will not be in service.
- 9 Verify/Update Emergency Contacts.** If your child presents COVID-like symptoms, they will be placed in an isolation room and will need to be picked up immediately. Please ensure contact(s) can be reached at any time.
- 10 Stay Informed.** Educate yourself from reliable sources such as the CDC (www.cdc.gov) and The Dallas County Department of Health (www.dallascounty.org) websites.

attached. The student's name, name of the medication, dose to be administered, and dispensing instructions should be included on the label.

Emergency and prescription medications must have an action plan/prescription permission form signed by the treating physician AND a parent. All incomplete action plans/permission forms will be returned. No medication will be accepted without a complete emergency action plan/permission form. Action plans can be faxed from the physician directly to me at 214-452-9002.

OTC medications should be delivered with a permission form completely filled out (**forms are available on the CKS website**).

Medication must be in its original labeled container, preferably unopened.

Most medications have expiration dates, and these dates need to be monitored. Expired medications will not be administered.

Medication that is received in an unlabeled container or plastic bag will not be accepted.

No vitamins/homeopathic supplements/essential oils etc. not regulated by the FDA will be administered during school hours.

As per the Diocese Medication Policy, "NO student may have medication in his/her possession during school hours."
