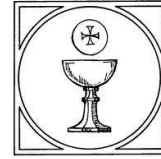

2011 Academic Competitions: PSIA and St. Patrick's

What are PSIA and St. Patrick's?

These are two different academic contests/competitions that are held annually. Students in grades 1-8 compete with other private schools in over 15 various events such as spelling, geography, math, art memory, ready writing, prose reading, etc. Participation can motivate your child in these ways: refine mental aptitudes, bring new excitement to learning, experience a sense of pride and dignity, foster self-discipline and perseverance, achieve recognition for academic excellence, and have fun!

When will the competitions be held?

PSIA will be held on **Saturday, Feb. 26th**. St. Patrick's will be held on **Friday, March 4th**.

How are students selected?

Interested students should fill out and return the attached "Interest Sheet". The actual events, and the number of students who can compete in them, vary by grade. Students should rank the events in order of their interest in competing. **EVERY FORM MUST BE SIGNED BY A PARENT.** Depending on the event and the grade, participants will be selected following the "**Competition Selection Process**" outlined below.

- **1st Method:** A **LOTTERY SYSTEM** might be used if there are more students wanting to compete in a particular event than there are spaces.
- **2nd Method:** A **TEST** might be given if there are more students interested in a particular event than there are spaces. (Any testing will occur in school.)
- **3rd Method:** A **PANEL, INCLUDING CKS TEACHERS**, might review all the interested candidates and then select the best match for the particular competition.
- **4th Method:** A **SCHOOL/CLASS COMPETITION** might be held and participants selected based on the results (for example: Speech Week, Spelling Bee, Math Test, Art Content, etc.).

Students who are selected are generally the students who are self-starters, eager learners, and have the ability to work in an intense environment. Contestants must maintain good conduct in the classroom in order to be considered as a potential competitor. Test scores, student's desire, and maturity all help identify those students who would be successful competitors and strong representatives from our school.

How are parents involved?

We have found that participants whose parents are actively involved in working with their children in extracurricular academic programs have the greatest success in competition, as well as in their future academic studies. Therefore, it is very important that parents help ensure their children do the necessary preparation work. It isn't fair to the student, or the school, to attend the competition without preparing adequately. In addition, both competitions are run by volunteers thus parents must be prepared to volunteer in some capacity if needed (i.e., hall monitors, judges, graders, making copies, or other administrative duties, etc.).

What are the next steps?

Complete and **Return the attached form to your child's teacher by Tuesday, October 12th**.

Students will be notified of their selection the first week in November and information about study materials or study groups will be given at that time.
